Just My Two Cents' Worth....

You may already know that the United States Postal Service has a rate increase scheduled to go into effect this month. The rate for a normal first-class letter is going up from 37 cents to 39 cents, and other services such as postcards & Priority Mail are also seeing modest increases. Please find enclosed here a few 2-cent stamps to help ease you through this transition period just a small part of my ongoing effort to save you time, money, and hassles!

An increase of a few pennies may not seem like much, but consider for a moment the volume of mail the USPS delivers each year. In 2005, they delivered over 98 billion pieces of first-class mail. While this is a staggeringly large number, and a slight bump up over 2004, it is a decrease from the 103 billion pieces delivered in 2001. Not coincidentally, the decline in volume began in 2002, the last year there was a price increase.

Each time the USPS raises rates, more customers—especially bulk mailers and other businesses—seek out different marketing options. With the continued expansion of email, the internet, and other electronic media, customers are looking for more cost-effective solutions. There's a simple principle at work here: the bigger the price tag something has, the smaller the number of people who will want (or even be able) to pay for it.

After the huge increase in housing prices here in the Phoenix area during 2005, we can apply the same principle to the local real estate market. The median price of a home rose by about 40% from January through December, and while this allowed many sellers to realize significant gains, it has also made the purchase process much more difficult for many buyers. In particular, investors who were attracted to our area's relatively low pricing are now turning their attention to other opportunities. Additionally, many individuals and families have found that increased home prices will require them to put off their plans for a new home until their income experiences a similar increase. Taken together, these factors have lead to a lessening of demand, which in turn has quickly lead to an increasing supply of homes on the market, and a rapid moderating of sales prices.

This doesn't mean we should expect any significant decrease in values. Just as the US Mail remains a great delivery option for many people, the Phoenix area remains a desirable destination for businesses & families. Now that the frenzy of 2005 is at an ebb, we expect to see a return to the steady growth the area has enjoyed in the past. Recipe of the Month Chicken with Mustard Cream Sauce

This is a great recipe. It doesn't require any fancy ingredients or equipment-you probably already have most of these items in your kitchen right now-and it is quick & easy to prepare. But the small effort yields big results, with a smooth & flavorful cream sauce to coat your stir-fried chicken strips.

1 Tbsp olive oil	1 Tbsp flour
2 garlic cloves, crushed	1 Tbsp coarse mustard
4 boneless, skinless chicken	Salt & black pepper
breasts, cut into 1" strips	Parsley sprigs for garnish
1 cup light cream	

- 1. Heat the oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add the garlic and cook for 2 minutes, stirring regularly. Add the chicken strips, drop the heat to medium-low, and cook for 10 minutes. Continue stirring to be sure chicken cooks evenly.
- With a slotted spoon, remove the chicken strips from the 2. pan, saving the juices for Step 4. Keep the chicken strips warm by covering them with foil, or placing them in a toaster oven on low heat.
- 3. In a small bowl, mix a little of the cream with the flour to make a smooth paste. Set aside for Step 4.
- Pour the remaining cream into the pan and stir into the 4. cooking juices. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, stir in the cream & flour paste, then drop heat to medium-low. Stir constantly for 2 minutes, until sauce has thickened. Stir in mustard, heating gently (boiling the mustard will vield a bitter flavor.) Add salt & pepper to taste.
- 5. Return the chicken to the pan, stirring well to coat the strips with the sauce. Serve immediately, garnished with parsley sprigs. Makes 4 servings.

You can dress this dish up with cous cous, fresh vegetables, and a bottle of white wine to serve with company, or just serve it over rice for a quick & tasty dinner parents & kids can enjoy together.
